BASIC DEFINITIONS & SKILLS

Address Bar: The field in a browser window where you enter a web address (URL).

Hand Icon: The cursor changes from an arrow to a hand when it is moved over a link in a webpage or document.

Hyperlinks (or Links): An electronic link embedded in a document that takes you to another webpage or document.

I-beam Icon: The cursor is shaped like an "I" when it is over text that can be selected and copied.

Internet: A global, electronic communications network connecting millions of computers.

Search Engine: Web programs that search internet content to find information matching search terms or keywords. Examples of search engines are Google and Yahoo.

URL (Uniform Resource Locator): Addresses used to locate specific sites or files on the web. Examples: bklynpubliclibrary.org and www.google.com.

Web Browser: A software application, such as Internet Explorer, Firefox or Safari, used to locate and display webpages.

Webpage: A document with its own address on the internet, usually containing links.

World Wide Web (WWW): Interconnected information and documents accessed through the internet. Commonly known as "the web."
